I have been thoroughly enjoying our sermon series through the book of Acts! The early church is a model for what the modern-day church should be; "A Church on Fire." My prayer, as we journey through this study, is that Macedonia will be a living example of what a New Testament church should be.

I want to share with you some opportunities to connect, grow, and serve that will be available in the month of September. First, we have some small groups that will begin on September 7th. The Emma Ruth Bible Coffee – a small group for women – will resume at 10:00 a.m. on that day and their study will be a book by Priscilla Shirer called *Élijah*: Faith and Fire. Another small group for women will take place that evening at 6:00 p.m. and they will be studying a book called The Power of a Praying Wife by Stormie Omartian. Both of these studies will take place in the conference room. The final small group that will begin that day is a small group for men. The group will have two opportunities to meet; one at 7:00 a.m. and one at 10:30 a.m. These groups will meet in the Fellowship Hall and will be studying a book by Tony Evans called No More Excuses. If you would like to be a part of any of these small groups, please contact the office and let us know.

Another opportunity to grow is to participate in Baptism Sunday on September 12th! Baptism is our first step of obedience after being saved and it is a wonderful testimony of what God has done in your life. If you have not been baptized since you were saved, then I would encourage you to sign up to be baptized. We can baptize in either of the morning worship time of 8:30 or 10:45. A final opportunity to connect and worship will take place on Sunday night, September 26th at 6:00 p.m. Our choir has been working diligently on a collection of Gospel songs; some of which they have been sharing in our worship gatherings.
